MEMORANDUM FOR: Chief, SR/6

SUBJECT : Debriefing of Robert Edward WEBSTER (201 - 265472)

1. Subject, who renounced his US citizenship in 1950 when he defected to the USSR and who returned to the US as an alien under the Soviet quota in May 1962, was debriefed by the undersigned together with OO/Contact Division and Air Force representatives in Pittsburgh, Penna., during 2 - 3 July 1962. (See Attachment A for biographic data on Subject) The undersigned used the pseudonym, Rudy Valentino, while the following used their true names: Messrs. Keller Stewart, Robert Starling and Jack Tague, of the OO office, Pittsburgh; Major E. J. Zvetina and Mr. F. G. Jaycocks, of the Air Force Foreign Technology Division, Wright-Patterson AFB, Ohio. The undersigned's aim was to determine if Subject was knowledgeable regarding detailed operational intelligence and Soviet Realities, while OO processed its normal requirements, including those of TSD, and the Air Force interrogated Subject along technical lines.

2. Because time was short, it was decided that the undersigned would conduct a chronological questioning and the OO and Air Force officials would enter the debriefing as appropriate. Therefore, the undersigned had about eight hours of debriefing opportunity and on this basis recommended that Subject be brought to Washington, D. C. for detailed debriefing.

3. Arrangements for Subject's quarters to be used also for debriefing were made through the Office of Security and Subject stayed at the Marriott Motel, Key Bridge, during 15-28 July 1962. See Enclosure A for a listing of staff personnel who participated in the debriefing of Subject; this listing includes the Aliases staff personnel used and dates on which they had contact with Subject. Enclosure "B" contains the undersigned notations made during various phases of debriefing and are attached for whatever value they may have in the future. Enclosure "C" is a Secrecy Agreement, dated 16 July 1962, signed by Subject and witnessed by the undersigned and Miss Eleanor Reed in pseudo. Enclosure "D", dated 27 July 1962, is a combination Secrecy Agreement and statement of truthfulness signed by Subject and witnessed by the undersigned and Miss Eleanor Reed (in pseudo). Enclosure "E" is a short biography on Subject prepared by Miss Eleanor Reed which can be used in the event of necessity.







1# Because there was short and two different offices participated in the debriefing, it is desired that AF would conduct a chronological questioning on Subject's experience and the CO and AF official would interject the ~~cross~~ questioning whenever appropriate.

AF obtained data from Subject on his employment and education with the Plastic Institute and factory in Leningrad; copies of their reporting will be forwarded via the Pittsburgh CO/C office. DDCI was primarily interested in all personalities with whom Subject had contact in the Soviet Union; this data plus Subject's documents, letters, etc., some of which Subject permitted the Agency to keep, will be forwarded to SR Division from Pittsburgh.

2# Subject appeared <sup>to be</sup> very cooperative and, in fact, said that he would do anything to help the US Government ~~to that~~ which would help him in his own mind to erase some of the stigma associated with his defection to the USSR. Although Subject ~~never~~ returned to the US on 20 May 1962, having defected in October 1959, Subject apparently began to forget <sup>details</sup> very quickly; however, his recall ability to recall improved after considerable questioning and conditioning. It was felt that Subject can provide a great deal of OI and realities data and arrangements were made to have him

3. The following are some significant facts derived from the preliminary debriefing: and comments of ~~decommissioned~~ value.

a. Subject states that he decided to defect because of family problems, <sup>personal and financial</sup>, which he could not cope and he took the easy way out. (Apparently his problem was associated with his wife inasmuch as he mentioned she just keeps ~~not paying~~ giving enough attention to their children.) Subject began planning of defection during the second in a series of three trips he made to the USSR as a representative of the Kroc Development Corp., Cleveland, Ohio, to set up a plastic exhibit. He confided in no one about his plans to defect. The following between his second and third trips to the USSR, he collected personal items which he <sup>wanted to keep</sup> ~~needed~~ during his residence in USSR and ultimately gain full cooperation to Soviet authorities in the defection formalities.

- \* 1. Subject said he had applied for Soviet citizenship 11 July 1959.
- 2. Official in U.S. advised that he had received Soviet citizenship - 17 September 1959.
- 3. On 26 October 1959 Soviet Ministry of Foreign Affairs telephoned American Embassy, Moscow, to advise that Subject had assumed Soviet citizenship.
- 4. On 17 October 1959 General Secretary of American Embassy, Richard E. Snyder met Subject at Central Committee of the "Vrazhdy i Registratsiya" (V.R.) of the militia at Bel Avenir Apartments, Moscow where Subject affirmed that he had applied for Soviet citizenship 11 July and on 17 September 1959. Subject had also applied for a Soviet internal passport which he had been told would arrive by 31 October 1959.
- \* 5. In late August, subject's sister, wife of Subject and child object in Moscow and asked whether she could return to the U.S. and if she should enroll the children in East Cleveland High School. Subject advised that he had no desire to return soon, the wife said she would transfer the children to Cleveland. Subject called a lawyer in Cleveland. He returned to Moscow, 10 Dec., 1959.

### Life in the U.S.

- 1. In October 1959 - 3 months prior to his application for Soviet citizenship, Subject was employed as a research chemist at the All Union Research Institute of Plastics (All-Union Research Institute of Plastics), Moscow.
- 2. Received 1959 Nobel Prize in Chemistry (Prize for Chemistry)
- 3. Taken to Japan to work in Plastics Institute (Institute for Chemical Science) in Kyoto. Subject stated he had already applied for Soviet citizenship in Kyoto.
- 4. After 1 year working at Kyoto, Subject went to PLASTOVY, when he had just started his own laboratory group. He was assigned, at his request from his mentor, to "Organic Chemistry" which subject did not understand. There subject worked on "Organic Compounds". When he living with his wife and son, with son to Kochi. Worked at Kochi Research Center. Subject married child, mother, 2 children of a scientist who he met while working in Kyoto, 1959, age 30, current address is Kochi, K-32, 500.
- 5. In spring 1960 Subject called his wife, saying he had no desire to return to the U.S.
- 6. In August 1960 Subject was given a position in Moscow. Subject advised that his research project will be conducted in Moscow and he will have no further Soviet affiliation.
- 7. In Aug. 1961 Subject reported to Moscow for Soviet Exit Visa. Granted Exit Visa 1962.
