Meeting with AUNHIP/1 on 20 October 1965

1. Mr. Al Gentalez (as "Mr. Santiage") and Mr. as "Tarry Wills") met with AUNHIP/1 in New York City 20 October 1965. with him first alone at the Taft Hetel from 1310-1330. The three them had lunch at the Red Ceach Grill from 1330-1500 and went afterwards to Genralez room in the Americana Hetel for a discussion which last until 1700. There were no security indidents during the meetings. 2. AUGHIP/1 returned to New York 1h October from his business trip in Europe and went the following day to Miami and the Meys "to fish". He came back to New York on 19 October. Yest of his time in Europe was about in Italy , especially Milan and vicinity. He was more briefly in Reno and Geneva. He spent two nights in Paris at the end of his trip. He did net ga te Spain, he said, because he wanted to get back to the U.S. A/l said that his friend is going to be in Madrid 23 October until 2 November when he plans to return to Havana. He has been in Europe for several months. A/I describes him as a mon whom he trusts completely and says that he has good access to banking circles knows the man who handles CASTRO's in Havana. According to A/1 finances, Pepin SANCHEZ, brother-in-law of Celia SANCHEZ. In Madrid icress will be Madrid. tel. $\lambda/1$ believes, as he has stated previously, that we should make contact with and consider recruiting him. h. Penin MARANJO---A/l said he knews that Lucy ECHRUJIKIA approached MARANJO for KUPARK. He said that MM Ambassador CARILLO also know this but interestingly did not mention it to A/1. CARTELD said that NAMESHAD had made deals to sell Cuban meat ## in Italy and Spaim. Amb. CARILLO -- A/L had a long lunch in Paris with Carillo and his mife;

and CARTILLO leaned A/1 his car to go shorping. A/1 indicated that JARRILLO was unchanged from the last time they met early in 1965—he is still a firm supporter of CASTRO but remains on friendly terms with A/1. A/1 asked if CARRILLO learned where Che SUEVARA was when he (C) was in Cuba recently and C teld him he did not know—that it was a very tightly held secret known enly to a few posple. (A/1 believes GUEVARA is still in Cuba.) C still hopes to become Suban Ambassador in Madrid.

6. Jewelry, Coins, Etc.——CARRILLO offered A/1 a variety of jewlery and coins and other items from Cuba. (SER ATTACHED LISTS.) C was asking from \$20,000 to \$25,000 for the whole works and would not sell it piecemeal. (A/1 said only the coins were really worth much, that the jewelry was junk, and that he effored C \$12,000 for the whole works. C declined the offer.

- 3. <u>Jewelry</u>—A/l said that the collection of silver, rugs, paintings, etc. which became imma up in Northern Italy earlier in the year was ultimately sold to a Turk. **Serms** The shipment was owned secretly and brio-a-brac was self-used to replace the original mods.
