FI/LHT files contain 255 positive information disseminations produced by Project LIENVOY during calendar year 1962 -- 130 regular CS disseminations, 116 teletype reports on subjects of current or priority interest, and mine transmittals of official documents from Communist or leftist organizations in Mexico. LIENVOY reports provided information on the Mexican Communist Party (PCN), the Popular Socialist Party (PPS), the new but increasingly rewarful National Liberation Movement (MLN) an anti-US, pro-Cuba Communist Front, on other Front or leftist organizations, and on individuals active in these organizations. Among the persons of intelligence interest most extensively reported on were Vicente LOMRANDO Toledano, head of the PFS and an official in the World Federation of Trade Unions; Jorge L. TAMAYO Castillejos, an avowed Markist appointed to a government position; Braulic MAIDONADO Sandez, Communist former governor of Baja California; the former president of Mexico, General Lazaro CARDENAS del Rio, head of MIN; and General CARDENAS son, Cuauhtemoc CAMDENAS Solerzano. LIZEVOY provided also information on Mexican contacts with Soviet Bloc countries, with Cuba, and with leftists of other Latin American countries; on Communist and leftist publications; on Prensa Latina and other Cuban propaganda efforts in Mexico; on the reaction of Maxican and international Communists to the imprisonment of famed muralist David AIFARO Siqueiros, and their activities on his behalf. Valuable reporting in connection with President Kennedy's visit to Maxico was provided — Communist plans for sabetage, the Government's tactics to inhibit their fulfillment, and information on favorable reaction to the US President's speech expressed secretly by pro-Communist nembers of the MIN. Among the disseminations which had to do with Cuba, a number reported the transshipment of goods, a subject of special intelligence interest and one, which reported the views of high-level government officials concerning the Cuban crisis, was described by CCI's analyst as extremely valuable.

2. The recently-issued (9 January 1963) FNIO cites as Third Category Priority National Intelligence Colectives the following to which LIENVOY reporting is relevant: "The reaction of Latin American Governments and peoples to developments in and with respect to Cuba; the vulnerabilities of particular

With resard to events which might be considered as bearing on the security of this project, the Station reported that on 15 June 1932, at approximately 3030, the conciongs noticed two men standing directly across the street from the LP and the second to have an unusual interest in the activity of the LF. After about an hour both got in an automobile and continued to watch the building from the car, and from time to time appeared to be taking notes on the comings and goings of the installations, as well as making notes on the cars used by the personnel of the LF. They attempted to follow one LF employee when he left for lunch. Later that day, LIENVCY-2 and IMENVOY-1: approached one of the two surveillance men and asked for an explanation of his action that day. They also asked hir to identify himself. He showed them a driver's license with the name Mariano VMRA Contalet. This information was checked at the bepartment of Traffic and found to be the license of another person. The Traffic Department was staked out to determine who, if anyone, might show an interest in the names and addresses of the cars used by LP personnel. On the 16th of June, an agent of the Jecret Survice of the Folice Headquarters showed up and tried to obtain information about the owner of the license ; lates on LIENVOY-2's car. The stake-out employee and secret Service ran checked the traffic files, but the information was not there. In conversation with the Scoret Service man, information was gained which led the Station to suspect that he was a member of an investigative group headed by a Mexican whose aim is to obtain positical information for Mexican politicians. Since the 15th, no further attempts to place the If under observation have been noted. Any problems such as this can be handled, if necessary, by the COS and his government contacts since this is a joint venture.

A. Current Objectives.

The objectives of this project remain the same as those stated in the last renewal request. The project continues to provide the Mexico
Station with a smooth and rapid
The Principal Agent continues to be a close associate of Fres IOPEZ
Mateos . The intercept center has undergone no major changes during
the past year.
1. RFDM-6 Objectives Priority A, 1. a; Priority A, 4, a, b, c; and Priority B, 2 and 3 continue to be effectively covered by this project. Cordial and friendly relations continue between
During the past year, the Chief of Station, Mexico, at the
request of the Chief, ODACID, Mexico, has held a number of covert
meetings with matters. The
Chief, ODACID, remains pleased with this access to
2. All Soviet and Czechoslovak installations in
Mexico City are covered by this project. The Case Officer
for Soviet Operations and the Case Officer for Soviet Satellite
Operations rely heavily on this product for operational leads
and data to support double agent operations.

- 3. All major anti-PBPRIME elements in Mexico City are covered by this project.
- 4. Targets of opportunity which appear to be hostile or critical to PEPRIME or to the present Government of Mexico are covered by this project.

All major objectives of the project are being effectively realized.

B. Changes.

At a yet to be determined date, it is planned to move the intercept center from its present location. Two reasons are behind this move:

1) security, since the present base has been used for almost three years: and 2) to provide the center with more mobile equipment. Such equipment is now under consideration by KURIOF and when it becomes available, an amendment to this project will be forwarded requesting approval for the transfer of the intercept center.

C. Intelligence Production.

The activities report forwarden to Headquarters each month lists the intelligence reports received from this project. During 1962 there were 534 intelligence reports produced by this project which were forwarded to Headquarters through 1 December 1982. All of these concerned RMTM-6 reporting priorities and current requirements levied by Headquarters and the ODACID installation.

In addition, this project produces a large amount of information which is not disseminated on a current basis but is reported to ODACID, ODENVY and other ODYOKE agencies in reply to a steady stream of routine file trace requests. These file trace requests run into the thousands each month. It would be difficult to determine the exact percentage of the information produced by LIE:NOY: but in many instances involving large portions of the file came to us through LIENVOY coverage.

D. Effectiveness.

The LIENVOY project provides the Station with a which is both effective and rapid as well as covert. The Station continues to receive the daily "resumen" highlights from the thirty (30) lines covered. A high percentage of current intelligence is disseminated from these daily reports. In addition, full transcripts are received on Soviet and lines and on any of the thirty targets we may request. A good part of this is personality data useful only to KUDARK and in some cases to ODENVY. In addition, the project provides a support mechanism for covering targets of interest to KUBARK or other ODYOKE agencies.

E. Problems.

There have been no significant security, cover, control or liaison problems during the past year.

F. Liaison.

From a liaison point of view, the Station believes that this project contributes freatly to the present toward ODYOKE policies. The liaison remains clandestine in nature though contacts between are usually made at the request of the

Interagency Coordination.

The Chief, ODACID, Mexico, is the only ODYONE representative in Mexico outside KUEANK who is aware of this project. His role has been

explained above and the coordination with NUTAUK is excellent.

H. Plans.

No significant operational changes are recommended for the next project year. Subject to the continuation of the present Mexican officials in their current positions, the project will not be changed.

I. Costs.

1. For the rast period.

The cost of the project (paid by Mexico Station exclusive of Headquarters costs) from 1 February 1962 through 30 June 1962 was US \$16,253.00 and from 1 July 1962 through 30 November 1962 (actual) US \$13,122.00 and \$7,600.00 for December and January (estimated). The total for the past year will be approximately US \$26,975.00.

2. For the next project year.

During the period 1 February 1963 through 31 January 1964, an estimated amount of US \$47,068.00 will be required with US \$18,210.00 to be spent from 1 February 1963 through 30 June 1963 and US \$28,858.00 to be spent from 1 July 1963 through 31 January 1964.
