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## HOHORAROUR FOR TRE RRCORD

SURJECT: HEPORE OF INTERROCATION
DATK: 30 July 1965

1. Today" lntermiogation consisted of two abor memeionm (1410-1515, aid 1610-1650). Subject vas confronted with proot of bis efrore on Komsonol regulations, and also of basic georgraphy in kaliningrati Oblast. Guegtioning vas confined to the two areaf, and illis be described belom. In addition, there mere som interontime aditional indications that Subject simy have apent sove time in Soviot jail or prison camp.
2. KOMSOMOL:
a) Degpite a number of leading questions and hinta, Subject vas unable to recall that LCmanol Congresse (the 12th) took place in Pebruary 1954, thile he vas allegedly the Secretmry of the SCD $8 / 0$. If he had really been a Enamol Secretary at the time be-should remember the Congrese very well, since be would bave been involved in its preparations. Told about it, subject aaid that much Congresses took place prectically every year. This in lalse; the previous komsomil Comegreas. the 11th; was in 1949:
b) Bubject agaim stated that be ras sure that the
 vala mown the pertineit Komsomol regtiations for the period. Ehich provide that the maximua age is 26. Subject mimply cantinued to lnaist that he in sure that he vaa excluded frem the kotasomil in 1954 then he reached the age of 37 , and that no exceptiong were made for him. Bo did mot comment on thow he could be wrong on the regalations if he had been a Enmanol Secretary.
c) In the discusaion of Romomol ragulationg, Subject comtinued to insist that the duee were $2 \%$ fur all members. He apotted the paragraph about $2 \%$ entry duem in the regulationa that rere shown to bia and eaz that monthly dues were identical mith entry dues. Imis is not so, but an ve do mot have copy of the 1949 mentronip dues acale, I. wat not mble to sisw him documentary prool of hit error.
d) Subject wes again ungble to describe how teay permanentiy regiftered as a menber of the MVD K/O. bow bo pertorme his duties as a secretary or mat these dutien were in connection tith the $12 t \mathrm{~h}$ Domsonol Congrean, or to wat the Secretary of the MVD $\mathbb{E} / 0$.
3. Service in the Baitic: In the courge of the discugsion of hif eeryice in the BaItic In 1952. Subject made such imcredible errors, and gave aucb lam descriptiong ol his work, that it is neceasary to conclude that be did not serve there am an intelilgence officer, aud that if be hag ever viaited that area at it vas only very brielly.
(1) Subject not only vas unable to nawo the Chiel of Intelligemce of the $4 t h$ Mavi Fleet, he couid not even give
 fais "machaluit razvedui;" actually, of courge, it ghould be "machainik razpedyvatelnogo uprivieniya" of the fit ileet).
b) Subject does not kaow the name of his lmadiate comanding Gificer, the chiet of the mbi. Subject did not fuce the namon of more then tro of bis fellow olficera at
 man - TEIBEIEY - that be had mot once mentioned uben undef minilar prosare in Apiil loes; it is mpparent thit he finvented 1 t the pot.
c) Bubject comtimued to insint that ho merved in
 amd tomind hiet the mame of the plece where be had allegediy" merved mag in lact Primorsi. Subject aid that be couldn't vinderfetand why ho had remembered it ag govetak, and gaid the hed never been in the city of Sovetat. Subject was also fhom the Administrative-Territorial Divisions of the
 Boviat Daion axcept the one in the Far Eant. Again, he had no explanition $10 r$ his erfor. Oddiy, atter imitininy concoding hia orror, from tim to time subject continued to gay that be thought that be wien probably Eigit after ail, and that the village of Sovetek vis too minil to mpene on the map that he vas shown.
d) In degcribing him faitial arrival at the mity sublect aid that he mrrivad 1n kiningrad, tbon lad to go:

-) Subject adwitted that be did not do any operational चork at the MEP, and said tbat was vby be was dimsaisisiled and vanted trminimr. However. Subject conld zot give a detailed or believibio deacription of what bis dutiea were. As be hat dome of often in the pait, be attemptod to divert
 parod lecture about the concept of atay-behind operntiona. Ho vase cut ofl.
4. (MOTR: In taikimg about his seryce ia suliningrad Oblage, subject ha mentioned Primorek, Sovetm, mad zelenogradek. It is interesting that town of identical or clomely eimilar
 Zolenogorak. Both Zelonogradaw and Zelenogortin ere resorta. The Primores and Bofietekiy in Leningrad Oblast are both on bo coast, about $10-12 \mathrm{kilometers}$ irom oach otwer. Beazing in. uind that Subject has previousiy deacribed vorkine in ino voods in limingrad oblaft in 1945 under conditions that cound very minilar to lorcod labor, it is poasible thet there is some clue here ns to how Subject "B legend vam prepared. At
 concluaions and the coincidoace la giaply moted for futare seterence.)

要. It the courre of the tomr inge of interrogition to finte, there have boen a mubor of indications thich tend to conifre previous impreasion that subject may hevernet fou cime as prisoner in soviet jeil or priaon ceap. An mome of thene have not been noted in the previous interroghetion roports it may bo convenient to mumanize then bere:
a) On 28 July Subject mode tbe intriguing remaly,
 question about how be kept track of the daye.
b) On 30 Juiy, Subject voluntarily Livpebed \&nto long and detalied erplanation of how be keops triek of the 4ay 1m nis pregent circumetinces. A ponible explanetion for thin nnolicited degcription is that Subject had. reilected

c) On 28 JuIy, vhile we giving Subject about the number of his Party maberabip card (vilch he did not remomber) Bubject amid, "I don"t oven remember my personal KGB number." I liwadiately asked bubject vhen such personal cerisl mamoris had boen ingtituted in the KCB, and he replied that be didn't neamber: that no one carried them oith them but kept them in the cale, that they vere intonded 10 vartime purpotes.

COMERAT: Personal Eerial mumbors never existed ither. In the army or in the KGB , and to the best of our krowledge they do not exist now. The only place in soviet sociesy pbore such numbers onisted is in the prison camp: tbis ves one of the chiof grievances and comb plaints that the primonera made in the lamour Vorkuta uprisinge of 1953.
d) In provious interfogathons subject has deacribed vorming in tho forests outeide of Lomingrad for two monthe in 1944. The conditions that he described sound such nore Ifke forced labor than that of a military unit.
-) Although tattooing is cartainly practiaed to mon osteat in the Soviet Kivy, Komsomol and Party pressurem Festrict to to coneiderable degree. The mubor and oxtent

c) Subject 'a fory about 15 day tentence. In the luybyanke bsaume of the venernal disease incident mugnemts that this may have beon inserted in his legend to cover silpm stening irom lomep prison experience. and possibly also to mely hit in pamging the polygraph.
b) Subject's earlier accoumts mbout IIghtime at Tuapmé
