BACKGHOUND

1. On 3 January 1963 Quinton N. OUSIER turned-over the responsibilities of inside Station control of the LINDTOR Project to Marvin A. CABOT during a meeting held with the outside Staff Agent for the LIMOTOR Project, Seymour D. TRUNNICH. What follows is the first in a series of Progress Reports which it is hoped will not only serve to keep Meadquarters advised of just what is going on in the LIMOTOR Project but will also serve to apprise Headquarters in greater detail of the performance of the LIMOTOR Staff Agent on the outside under student cover. During the period under review TRINNICH's replacement, Natalie S. MICHNOFP arrived to take over the outside responsibilities for LIMOTOR. In the future regular Progress Reports on LIMOTOR will be substitted on a quarterly basis.

PRETINGS

2. During the period under review 32 meetings were held with Seymour D. THINNICH by Marvin A. CABOT. Two of these meetings were in CABOT's home under the cover of darkness. The remainder were

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
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at four selected sesting sites on the streets of the metropolitan area. They have code names and were chosen to allow for maxisum check of possible counter-surveillance (use of one-may streets, etc.). CART turses TRIVHICH at the predetermined site at a predetermined time and ultimately picks-up TRIVHICH in his QP woulde. These meetings are then held in CART's car. Two special emprymery meeting sites have been selected but never used; one is close to TRIVHICH's residence, and the other close to the UNAM.

- 3. As can be seen from the number of smetings held in a seven month period, they were usually held once a smek. TRIBNICH's meetings with the other LIPDTOR assets were so arrenged to allow for a minimum passage of time between the field agents smetings and the smeeting with CASOT. The TRIBNICH-CADOT meetings usually last, on the average, two hours. Specific requirements were passed and administrative matters were attended to. Usually TRIBNICH reviewed with CASOT each report received from the LIMOTOR agents and immediate guidance is given where possible. Since these meetings were TRIBLICH's only contact with the Chation, deliberate efforts were under to keep him abreast of general Station developments as well as KURAFK developments. This has proven to be a distinct advantage from the standpoint of the outside Chaffer's morale, making him feel such more part of the Station and what it is trying to accomplish.
- 4. TRINVICH is turn had predesignated secting sites for LIBOTOR's 14, 19, and 22, similar to those cited in paragraph 2 above, and picked up his agents in his QP whiche. Effective 7 March TRINVICH began preparation of contact reports with each of his agents. In turn LINDTOR-14 was instructed to prepare a short report on each of his sectings with LIEDSTOIL-2.

OPERATIONAL.

- 5. Since January 1963, the Shation has attempted, through its regular contact with Seymour D. TRIMICH, to gain further insight into just what soes on at the UNAM which is of interest to the Station, and at the same time to excede the LINCTOR assets and their expabilities in terms of the UNAM. The LINCTOR project is, as stated in the Project Renewal, an important Station seyes and ears sectionism at the UNAM. Eased on a look at IJPOTOR for the period under review the Station notes the following:
 - a. While the Project is producing it has received little in the way of suidence from the Station or Head-quarters on information which it should collect. A re-examination of access was also necessary.
 - b. There was : insufficient coordination with Station WICAGE activities at the GRAM.
 - e. While it did produce, little of the product was equaldered of value for formal dissemination.
 - d. There was little or no play-back into the LIVOTOR Project. That is to say that while the Project itself, primarily in the person of TRIBUCK displayed initiative and generated activity, it often ended just at that point. This contributed to low morals, particularly as it concerned TRIBUCK.



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6. At the beginning of the period under review, the LIMCTOR stable consisted of the following assets:

> LIMUTOR-14 (who maintained contact with LITTEROIL-2 and LIKAYAN.-6; the latter served as a contact to LITHUROTL's 3 and 4)

LIHOTOR-19

LINCICF-22

At an early stage in the TFINTIC!-CANOT relationship, i.e., the 24 January secting, steps were initiated via LINCTOR-14 to accomplish the termination of LIXAYAK-6 and LITEYEROTL's 3 and A for lack of production. This was finally completed effective the end of March 1963. Although a bid for drop or termination pay was made, it was rejected. In order to provide LIMAYAK-6 with a means of ecutaet tipuld acrothing of importance develop in the future, LE-DTOP-14 was instructed to acquire a Post Office Box, which he did. It was taken out in the alias used by LIMMOR-14 with TIXAYAK-6 (Pedro MORAN) and also the alias used by LIMMOR-14 with LIDMSROIL-2 (Nago de la Torre) as an emergency means of contact (using a telegram).

- 7. As a matter of operational background, Saymour D. Talimick was brown to LIMDTOR's 14, 19, and 22 under his true name. They also knew his home telephone number which were used for communications from them to him. LIMOTOR-14 was unaware of the existence of LIMDICA's 19 and 22. He knew CUTLER under his true michasse. Although LIMOTOR's 19 and 22 knew each other slightly rocially, they were unmare of each others clandestine relationship with TRIBNICH. LIPUICE-19 knew Phiness P. SLINKARD through their sless cooperation on the BEXICK/FEXTAVE operation (under true name). LIMOTOR-19 also know OUSLER under true first name.
- 6. With paragraph 7 in wind, there follows a brief resume of each of the LIMOTOR agents:
 - A. LIEBRUIL-2. For the current period this agent has been a key writer for one of the leading UNAF student newspapers, Tovolucionario. He is well-versed in UNAF student affairs and has a wide range of contacts with student leaders. He and the newspaper were of carticular interest to us, particularly tecmise the latter was considered one of the biggest at UMAN but because it was also financed by the private secretary to LITENSOR in the mans of LITENSOR's office. Rowever by August Revolucionario was in bad financial straits, victim of emberglement of finds, and virtually extinct. Through LDCTOR-14 we have attempted to exploit LIEPOPOIL-2's other emmedions. We have tried to raise the level and desirability of his reporting. LIEMBROIL-2 does

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not know LIMOTOR-14 by his true name, nor does he know that LIMOTOR-14 represents OCYONE or PEPRIME. We have tried to impress on LIEMBROIL-2's mind that he is working for a "group of Mexican businessmen interested in knowing what is going on at the UNIME. This agent is paid 1,500

B. LIMOTOR-14. With the termination of LIKATAK-6 and LIMOTOR-14, this agent's responsibilities consisted of secting LIMPBROIL-2 and thereafter to trumslate his reports. This we feel is not sufficient work for this agent whom we feel is a valuable long-range asset, and capable. We have been attempting to interest him in becoming a safe-house keeper in addition to his regular duties. We is also paid 1,500 peace monthly. We have taken on additional responsibilities at his present place of employment, but as a target it is presently completely uninteresting to us. Should LIMPTOR ever acquire additional non-PUPRING assets, this agent would be the handler. He is a Mexican citizen.

C. LIMCTOR-19. This agent continues to concentrate on possible leads to present or future renters of the Fexican equivalent of OLACID (see Project Renewal, VI. PLANS, B). Also during the period under review she did yeoman service in the BECHICK/PERNAYS case (see also paragraph 3d (2) of HPMA-22370, dated 24 October 1953). In the first category she has already completed preliminary write-ups on ten of the 29 students of the senool in question. She is one of the finest elicitors of information we have seen and continues to do a fine Job, whatever her assignment sight be-Toetdowtally she is on the executive board of the group, a strange constellation of statemes, and visitors including diplomats. LIDTOR-19 is the regular source of the Station's list of School for Foreigners students.

D. LINOTOR-22. He is a passive asset at the DHAY who has been instructed to report all that he sees or hears which deals with student political groupings of the left in all faculties at UNAM, with particular attention to student elections and political alignments. He has been in the best position, along with LIPMSPOIL-2 to report on the activities of LICOAX and LILITY-C. LIMOTOR-22 specifically, as well as LIMOTOR's 1% and 19, was scheduled for an LCFILITTER examination. The results of that examination will be discussed in the Progress Report covering the period after August 1963 or in a saparate dispatch.

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9. As indicated in the Project Peneral we have no immediate plans to expend numerically the assets of LIMOTOR.

PPODUCTION

10. During the period January - June 1963, 225 raw reports were produced by the LIHOTOR essets. Of these, 38 originated with Seymour D. TRIBNICH; 3 with LIMOTOR-14; 33 with LIMOTOR-14; 33 with LIMOTOR-19; and 76 with LIMOTOR-22. These figures may be further analyzed as follows:

The personality reports were routed to interested Station officers and were then sade part of existing personality files at the Station. All of the reports connected with the UKMM were read by the Station KUKAGE officers for whatever action they felt was necessary. Reports dealing with ES subjects or personalities were routed to SLINKAGD. This ray report production does serve to strungthen Station CI and personality files and by its very nature little of it ever sees the light of day in terms of formal dissemination outside the Station (an exception was FEXI-6693).

12. Unfortunately, only two of the 225 raw revorts received formal dissemination, both origination with LIETROIL-2 (1943-6939 and 7577). As indicated in the Project Renewal submitted with HEVA-21650 and in FFVA-22370, it is known through proper suidence and increased direction to be able to raise the level of disseminable information originating within the LIETOTOR Project. Efforts will be made to enlist the support of the MEMISCH Political Section as well as the local TOILOWACE to better channel the LIEDOTOR efforts and increase eustomer interest in the product, by providing the Station with suitable gridance where possible.

COVER

13. The Station has not encountered ever problems within the Project during the period under review. The capability of the Project is cortainly enhanced by the fact that the Staff Agent outside is under student cover. He can develop expertise in the LIMOTOR target through his daily activities and comment with greater sathority on the production of other LIMOTORs.

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SECUFITY

14. Since early 1963 plans were rade for the eventual appearance of an ICPLUITER team from Handpurrters. Based on earlier correspondence, LINTOR-22 was a price candidate, and both LINCTOR's 19 and 22 were included in further planning for the LCPLUITER visit.

15. No security incidents have occurred during the period under review. As indicated in paragraph 3 shows, Staff Arent meetings are held as close to the regular sectings with the inside Staffer as possible. Exercisely meetings can always be arranged. During the reporting period stops were taken to starilize the LIFSTOR raw reterial as such as possible, to protect it against exposure of assets should it over become compromised.

ADMINISTRATIVE

16. Effective 1 July 1963 LIMOTON-19's salary was increased to 4,360 peace per month (less PEPRIME tax deductions). No other salary increase are contemplated.

17. All LIPUTUR production (res reports eited under PRODUCTION shows) is routed to COS and DCOS plus the interested Station officers.

CCXCLUSION3

18. During the period under review, definite progress has been seds toward the objectives as set down in paragraph 5 above. Plans call for Marvin A. CASOT to brief the Station's operational staff on LUDITCR during one of the regular weekly operational staff poetings. Similarly, plans called for a useting of CABOT, TRIBUICH, and NICHMOFF with Station KUCAGE officers. Continued effort is being made to improve the quality and scope of LUDITCR agent reporting. And last but not least, three non-productive LUDITCR Agents were dropped. The next LUDITCR Progress Report will descriptives even further progress toward these modest objectives.

1%. One overall factor must also be considered. In view of the scope of this Station's operational activity, and given the very special political complexion of the student body and faculty of the UAMA, this Station cannot easily allow itself the lummy of being without a LIPOTOR-type project.
