1. During 4 through 10 December 1964, Howard A. TRECKLER and AMNP-1 were in Madrid in connection with reference operation. On 6 December, AMNP-1 went to visit a cousin of his wife after which he was to meet TRECKLER at 1900 hours in the cocktail lounge of the Hotel Castellana Hilton.

2. AMNP-1 arrived in the lounge at approximately 1900 hours in the company of the relative he had been visiting, and immediately upon entering the lounge he was accosted by AMALASH-2 and AMALASH-3, acquaintances of his from past years. AMNP-1 took them and the relative to a table where they had few drinks. Although TRECKLER was present in the lounge, he was not exposed to them. The group departed after approximately an hour. In a brush contact, TRECKLER instructed AMNP-1 to report promptly anything of significance which might occur during the balance of the evening. At 0330 hours on 7 December AMNP-1 came to TRECKLER's hotel room and reported the following.

3. AMALASH-2 and AMALASH-3 stated they were interested in establishing contact with KULAK. AMALASH-3 gave as the reason for his not following up AMNP-1's initial contact with him in Paris in March 1964, that he had been waiting for his father and wife to get out of Cuba. His wife is now in Spain and his father is in New York City. AMALASH-2 said he had sent his father to ZIMETAL to contact AMNP-1 but that his father had been advised AMNP-1 was unavailable at the time. AMALASH-3 stated he was no longer under a cloud with the Cuban government as the Ambassador in Paris had put in a good word on his behalf with President OSVALDO GUPTIAGO.

AMLAASH-2 said he was aware AMNIP-1 was working for the CIA, stated that he didn't wish to be involved in politics, after his reputation had been maligned mostly by the Cuban exile community. AMLAASH-2 expressed a preference in work of a Cuban type, through AMNIP-1 or through USA. A letter from Justice Dept. in addition, AMLAASH-2 stated that if something big was in the offing in Cuba he would be able to go back for a short time preceding the action but that on a long term basis he probably would not last.

b. AMNIP-1 told AMLAASH-2 and AMLAASH-3 he would entertain for breakfast on 7 December at the Castellana Motor Hotel and advise them if AMLAASH-2 had any funds on their behalf. After meeting with the (CIA) TIECKLER advised AMNIP-1 to tell them there was nothing at this time but that he would let them know if anything developed. AMNIP-1 advised them of this and came away with the impression that AMLAASH-2 and AMLAASH-3 are opportunists, only looking for money, and not worth the time and effort of handling.

c. On the evening of 7 December, TIECKLER and AMNIP-1 were caught together walking along Avenida Jose Antonio by AMLAASH-2 and AMLAASH-3 when the latter pair got out of a taxi enroute to a movie. TIECKLER drove off and waited while AMNIP-1 spoke briefly to them. No further contact was made with AMLAASH-2 or AMLAASH-3 during the rest of the trip.

d. Regarding their initial contact, AMLAASH-2 asked AMNIP-1 if he was aware that Kubelio MONTENEGRO Chasp was in Madrid with a Cuban Trade Delegation and whether he knew MONTENEGRO personally. AMNIP-1 replied in the negative to both questions and said that the only MONTENEGRO he knew was a factor VASQUEZ Montenegro, a former associate in the Cuban G-2. AMLAASH-2 stated that he and AMLAASH-3 had lunched with the delegation this day.

e. The following items of interest were gleaned from AMNIP-1's conversations with AMLAASH-2 and AMLAASH-3.

a. Felipe LLACUDI Hernandez was in Paris recently after attending a three month training course in the Soviet Union. (LLACUDI is a Cuban intelligence officer in the International Section of the Direction General de Inteligencia (DCI) and is known to AMNIP-1). Reportedly in attendance with LLACUDI at this course were Manuel PINERO Losada ("Tarturoja"), the Chief of the DCI, "Papo" (LNU) and another unknown person. LLACUDI bragged about having been in conversations with the head of the KGB. LLACUDI was supposed to travel to Algeria, then return to either Paris or Madrid. (The Paris Station reported this from another source in PARISSET, 6 December 1964.) LLACUDI and Segundo PEREZ Alvarez were in Canada a few months ago.

b. Segundo PEREZ Alvarez is currently in Paris. He was replaced in his position in the Cuban Foreign Ministry following a nervous breakdown.

c. "Pao" IGLESIAS Pardo (probably Rogelio IGLESIAS Pardo), a

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... and the Cuban Government. The Cuban Government has been trying to get rid of him for some time now. He is considered to be a threat to the Cuban Government because he is supporting too much Cuban Communism. He is not a member of the Cuban Communist Party, but he is a communist. He has been working for the Cuban Government before. ... and he has crossed the line. ... and he is replaced as Minister of the Interior, Jose ALFREDO GUTIERTZ, the Chief of the Department of Internal Security (DSE), responsible for security, would get the post.

a. AMBALA-1 was in Paris as an official government P/C.

c. ⁰² (C) AMBLT-1 is in Madrid and will do anything for money.

d. AMBLN-1 is back in the good graces of the Cuban Government.

e. Luis Miguel Angel AGUINOUZ, the Director of Cuban Airlines, was recently in Madrid and Paris. He is a member of the Cuban Security Service (not specified whether it is DSE or DSC) and a good friend of Fausto CHAVARRIA, Cuban Minister of Transportation.

f. Both SILVIO CASTILLO and Miguel GUTIERTZ were supposed to travel from Cuba to Paris, from where they wanted to travel to other parts of Europe. CASTILLO was described as a negro ex-farmer Captain in the Cuban G-3 who is now a member of the DSE. He was reportedly trying to pose himself off as an anti-Communist in order to infiltrate Cuban exile groups. GUTIERTZ was described as a former Captain in the Cuban Army and an aide to Eugenio AMILCAR DE LA TORRE, Vice Minister of the Armed Forces.

g. On the evening of 7 December, AMNIP-1 claimed to meet AMSPORT-1 and ALWHP-1, old friends of his from pre-Castro days. Apparently ALWHP-1 was not yet aware that AMNIP-1 had defected, for in the initial portions of their conversation he tried to recruit AMNIP-1 for KUBARK. Following this meeting, AMNIP-1 inquired of TRACIEK as to the status of AMSPORT-1 and ALNIP-1 via 2-vis KUBARK. TRACIEK answered truthfully, in replying he did not know, and attempted to fend off further inquiries from AMNIP-1. What followed was a classic example of the Cuban circle of infiltration through association. AMNIP-1 has been asking KUBARK to let him contact AMLASA-1 for a recruitment pitch and Headquarters has been fending off AMNIP-1 for obvious reasons. AMNIP-1 asked why we could not go to Paris to pitch AMLASA-1 and was stalled again by TRACIEK. In his conversation with AMSPORT-1 and ALWHP-1, AMNIP-1 discovered that they had recently been in Paris. From this, AMNIP-1 deduced that (1) AMSPORT and ALWHP-1 were both old friends of AMLASA-1 and had been in Paris recently while AMLASA-1 was there, (2) AMSPORT-1 and ALWHP-1 were apparently working for KUBARK, (3) EUSIPK could not let him make a contact with AMLASA-1, (4) therefore KUBARK was already in contact with AMLASA-1 via AMSPORT-1 and ALWHP-1.

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
