1. Summarized in the paragraphs below is a report supplied by AMOT-2 on 30 March 1965 concerning a Cuban refugee residing in Miami, Miguel de LEON Rojas aka "Cuco", who is in contact with various KUBARK assets. The information was provided by Manuel LOPEZ Lourido, a personal friend of AMOT-2 in Madrid and by AMCRAG-1, a member of the AMOT Group, who has been in contact with LEON in Miami. <i>Contact of subj. of 201-294683</i>

2. In mid-1964, Miguel A. de LEON Rojas was reportedly making trips from the US. to Europe for the purpose of contacting GOC officials. Funds for his trips allegedly came from AMWORLD-2 and AMBIDDY-1.				
3. LEON was reportedly in contact with AMLASH-2 and AMLASH-3 in Spain on 9 October 1964. LEON also reportedly accompanied AMLASH-3 to Paris on one occasion. Meetings with these individuals allegedly related to AMLASH-1's stay in Paris and concerned means of internal rebellion in Cuba.				
4. According to LOPEZ, AMLASH-3 is very dissatisfied at present with the result of his contacts with AMBIDDY-1, as none of the things they had agreed upon have been fulfilled. LEON is also allegedly dissatisfied with AMBIDDY-1, and indicated that the only reason he maintains contact with him is because he has no other connections.				
5. LEON told LOPEZ that he was in touch with AMSPORT-1 in Spain who worked for a person with same true name as GROVER.

6. LEON reported to ANCRAG-1 that he was a close friend of AMWHIP-1 who lives in New York and who makes frequent trips to Europe and who is a friend of AMLASH-1; that AMWHIP-1 wanted LEON to work with him. LEON also told ANCRAG-1 that he had made arrangements and contacts with elements from Cuba, and that he has been able to obtain very useful work plans and information which he has given to AMBIDDY-1.

7. LEON informed ANCRAG-1 that on 17 March 1965 he had a telephone conversation with AMLASH-3, during which conversation AMLASH-3 expressed his dissatisfaction and said he was going to request his transfer to Cuba to join his group inside. LEON added that he could still make contact with AMLASH-3, but that at this moment he had absolutely no "support".

8. LEON told ANCRAG-1 that he had left the following requirements in Europe:

- a. Obtain the secret codes used in the Cuban Embassy in Madrid.
- b. Put a double agent into service in order to obtain information on the Party nets in the Caribbean area.
- c. Obtain a permanent source of information on the entire Cuban Foreign Service in Europe.

According to LEON, all these requirements have been left pending due to AMBIDDY-1's unreliability.
