2101	TUCHMIN arrived in same car; he got out and walked to corner of Luis Moya and Independencia, then came back to car.

- 3. According to LIFEAT, when Subject called TUCHRIN (suspect GRU) on 4 April 1966, he asked if LECROY was in Mexico. (Nikolay Sergoyevich LECROY, 201-132139, is Press Attache in Mexico and known Rüß officer.) On 5 April 1966 Subject called and spoke to LECROY's wife. Subject said he would like to visit a large narm in Mexico. LECROYA said to give their regards to Tamara POPOVA (presumably the wife or Aleksey Yakovievich POPOV, 201-138104, Soviet Counselor in Ottawa). LIFEAT Indicates that LECROY met Subject's plane and was with Subject until 0130 on 27 April 1966. LIERYOY also reports that Subject tried to contact LECROY on 23 April 1966.
- 4. According to LIFEAT, Subject tried to contact TUCHNIN the morning after his arrival to let him know he had arrived. TUCHNIN was out and expected home at 1400 hours. Subject called back that afternoon, said he had been sightseeing around Mexico City until 1400 hours. TUCHNIN's wife said that TUCHNIN would probably be tied up all differnoon at the Embassy. Subject said TUCHNIN and LECNOV were the only people he wanted to see in Mexico.
- 5. Subject told TUCHNIKA that he had had a gay time in Chile. He and (Vitaliy Ivanovich) KUBYSH (201-288305) and (foul POLYARUV had stayed in the same hotel. He did not know whether KOSYSH would stay in Chile or not.
- 6. Subject also told TUCRRINA that he had two names and addresses of people in Maxico who spoke English, since he spoke no Spanish, but he seemed rejuctant to look them up without naving someone along who could at least speak Spanish to the taxl driver. One of the men was (fnu) FLORES, whom Subject believed to be a university professor. (CORMENT: Possibly Horacle FLORES de is Pena, leftist Director of the School of Economics at URAM).
- 7. Apparently TUCHMIN was unable to see Subject until the afternoon of 28 April 1966. TUCHMIN said he had been sure LEUHOV would take care of Subject, but Subject seemed somewhat put out over YUCHMIN's neglect. Subject wanted to borrow luchmin's camera to take some pictures of the historical sights, " and luchmin agreed to meet him that afternoon. (Source: LIFEAT).
- 8. LIFEAT also reported that on 27 April 1966 Andres Gunther FRANK (American Communist in Mexico, former professor at the School of Economics at UMAH) told Enrique SEMO Calev (201-754927, elternate mamber of the Central Committee of the PCM) that a friend of his (Subject) was in town and that one of the things he would like to do was most with the director of the Central Campesing <u>ingeongdiente</u> (CCI - Mexican Communist peasant organization, the head of the PCM faction of which is Arturo OROHA Gamez, who is also a member of the Central Committee of the FCM). SEMO agreed to make the appointment for 28 April 1955, saying no would describe Subject as correspondent for a Soviet agricultural memspaper. FRAME added that Subject was also very interested in information on the soit in Maxicall, and SEMD said he would try to arrange on appointment with an engineer who had written on the subject. In the megazine Politica. Subject than spoke to SEHO and repeated the fact that his two main interests were in learning what the CCI was doing and finding out about the salt. (CCMENT: Since LECADY is a close contact of SEMO's, and Subject was in contact with LECADY, it uppears strongs that Subject went through FRANK to reach SEMO. An explanation lies possibly in the report

from LIFEAT that FRANK has an offer which he appears to be seriously considering to teach at a small university in Montreal, appearently starting in September 1966. He is also negotiating with a "new university" in Toronto. FRANK may thus have been one of the two names of people given Subject to look up in Maxico (cf. para 6 above) in connection with his future job in Canada.)

- 9. The Station would be interested in knowing whether Subject is an identified GRU officer, particularly in view of his contacts with the PCM on his visit here.
- 10. Subject to Headquarters' concurrence, the Station suggests that the Station be told of Subject's contacts with TUCHMIN and LEONOV and with FRANK. The Station would appreciate any information available to the SMAROVES confirming FRANK's plans to move to Canada.
