- The following information is from LIFRAT on the DOLGOV and LEONOV lines. DOLGOV had originally tried to find hotel accommodations for Subject, but since all the hotels were full, Subject finally stayed with DOLGOV. Just before Subject arrived in Mexico, DOLGOV spoke to LEONOV about where to take Subject, saying that he wanted to get in touch with "Rebet Sharko" (phonetic, no Station traces), who LEONOV said was in Veracruz. Subject and DOLGOV were in Verscruz from 10 to 12 August 1966. They also hoped to see General Heriberto JARA Corona, an old friend of the Soviets', in Verscruz. Subject and DOLGOV hoped to visit the Dominican Republic but never received visas. The day before Subject's arrival, DOLCOV spoke to "Suarez" (probably Luiz SHAREZ Lopez of the Markist magazine Siemore), who told DOLCOV that Marcio MEJIA Ricart from the Dominican Republic was there with his, and DOLGGV asked MEJIA to leave his address in the Dominican Republic so that DOLGOV (and Subject) could visit him when they went there. On 13 August 1966, apparently having given up on the Dominican Republic, they tried to get plane tickets to Ciudad Juarez, but because of the U.S. airline strikes no planes were available.
- 4. Subject reportedly had or attempted to have interviews with the following people in Mexico (Source: LIFEAT):
- Subject was in contact with the Agence France Press correspondent Robert Maurice KATZ (201-104222) several times during his stay in Mexico. KATZ had been informed of Subject's visit by "Monsieur Foster" (phonetic).
- b. At 1730 hours on 8 August 1966 Subject and LEONOV had an appointment to visit the Harxist newspaper El Dia. "Senor Javier" (not identifiable) was to be at El Dia for the appointment.
- On 9 and again on 12 August 1966 DOLGOV asked for an appointment for Subject with LIENVOY-1. The latter was out of town, and although his secretary said she would call as soon as he came back, probably Subject did not see him

d. On 9 and again on 12 August 1988 DOLGOV tried to get an appointment for Subject with Agustin LECORRETA Lopes, Director of the Banco Nacional. Finally DOLGOV was told that LEGORIETA was out of town and that an interview would not be possible in any case because of the bank's policy.

- On 9 August 1968 DOLGOV asked for an appointment for Subject with Gabriel ALARON, Jr., Public Relations Director of the (moderate) newspaper El Estaldo de Mexico. Attached is a clipping showing Subject with ALIEUM during an interview on 10 August 1966.
- f. Tugoslav Tanjug correspondent, Toze RAYAJIOVIC sent regards to Subject through Valentin Ivanovica XUCFTROW (201-75017) (703) representative in Poxico and probably FOR. RAYAJIOVIC said he had prepresentative in Moxico and prohably FCB. EAFAJLOVIC said he had not Subject in Paris. KUCHEROV mentioned that he had taken Subject to El Estaldo (cf. above). Apparently Subject did not talk personally with RAFAJLOVIC in Mexico. 201 1012 11 15 N. 1877/AA. 201.013/35.
- DOLGOV and Subject had an appointment at noon on 12 August 1966 to disit Luis SUAREZ Lopez at the (Marxist) magazine Siempre.
- h. The evening of 12 August 1966 DOLGOV made arrangements for Subject to meet Luis SANCHAZ Arriola, newspaperman with the -(Markist) newspaper El Dia. On 15 August 1968 SINCHEZ Arriola planned to meet Subject and DOLGOV at noon and take them to the Venezuelan (?) Embassy (presumably in regard to Subject's visa, On 15 August 1968 SANCHEZ Arriola but it seems odd that SANCEEZ Arriola needed to take them there).
- 5. LIENVOY reported the following additional contacts of Subject's in Mexico : /
- a. Viadinir Ivanovich SHPAKEVICH (201-343894), The and known ECH, made an appointment for Express to Third Sacretary Er. Buneolo DAVALOS Eurtado, Director of the National Euseum of Anthropology at 1100 hours on 13 August 1966 at his home.
- b. On 15 August 1966 Subject and DOLGOV talked to the Mexican Foreign Minister, Antonio CARRILLO Flores, & The appointment was arranged by Guillermo TARDIFF, Press Chief of the Mexican Foreign Offico.
- c. Alchsandr Aleksandrovich NIKITIN (201-784917), Soviet Films representative in Mexico and suspect £53, sent a letter with Carlos PLAZA Izquierdo, a film distributor in Venezuela.

  PLAZA Izquierdo did not, however, meet Subject, because he had left Venezuela on 14 August 1966 for Colombia and had then come to Mexico on 20 August 1966 to Mexico on 20 August 1966.
- 6. According to LIFEAT, Subject speaks reasonably good French, which he prefers to Spanish. Subject can also make himself understood in Spanish and English.
- 7. Subject's relationships with the Soviets in Nexico is of interest, as reported in LIENVOY and LIFEAT. As stated above, DOLGOV was in charge of Subject during his stay in Mexico. DOLGOV asked LEONOV's help in getting appointments with local press representatives. KUCHEROV took Subject around at DOLGOV's request, and DOLGOV also asked KUCHEROV to go with him to the airport to and DOLGOV also asked KUCHKROV to go with him to the airport to see Subject off. At Subject's request, NIKITIN got a copy of a local commercial movie, "Thisky and Vodka," and had a film showing the evening of 9 August 1966. MIKITIN told DOLGOV that he had better bring a bottle of vodka along, because the "chief" was also coming to the showing. Earlier that day EGB resident Sergey Sergeyevich KONSTANTINOW (201-101794) had said that he was coming

CONTINUATION OF BCRET EXCHA - 29870 DISPATCH to the showing and asked whether he could bring his wife. the Ambassador was not in Mexico, it appears that EDMSTATTINGV was meant by "the chier." Also, on 13 August 1936 DOLGOV was cold to come to the Soviet Embassy at 1100 hours and bring Subject along. When DOLGOV desurred, saying that they had an appointment, the Embassy Guty officer told DOLGOV that this was business. DOLGOV asked if it was "upstairs," and when the duty officer said he thought so, then DOLGOV said they would come. This neems to indicate a KOB meeting in the secure area of the Entarry. Since all of the above Soviets in contact with Subject are known or suspect EGB officers, the ANLADLE tentative identification of Subject as EGB reported in Reference A seems supported by Subject's activities in Mexico. It is also noted from LITTAT that on 12 August 1966 Radio Moscow correspondent Ruslan Aleksandrowich TUCHNIN (201-205304), who is suspect CRU and in the Crus not believed to be a KGB officer, asked Dicov, the rest for this feet action that there was no roing in drawing subject. 8.
