SUBJECT: Mooting with AMMUSICAL/1

.... p.2..... Buring the discussion with Loudwin and PARKER (of the FRI), Parker asked so, strictly off the record, what we thought of the operation. I replied that we had been about ready to terminate it when we turned in over to the FRI in August 1960. He said that personally he felt the seme about its value."

"At 2:30 y.m. I left FMI Hgs. with Loudwein and Parker. Parker drove us to the Motel, dropped Loudwein and me off, and went out to pick up A/1. by first impression of A/1 was that he was somewhat pale and wan and nervous. Loudwain related later that it probably was due to the fact that A/1 had soldon eaten regularly lately. I was introduced to A/1 as Mr. Ryman from another government agency in Washington, who would be taking over the case now that A/1 was going abroad for an extended period. Although A/1 didn't ask, I have little doubt that he knew who the other government againsy was. I told him that we were corry to hear about the death of his mother.... Then after a short embange I sained him what his plans were for travel abroad. He said he was leaving Thursday morning, Al August on SAS Fit. muster 912 for Copenhagen, expected to arrive there at 8:45 on Friday, 1 September. In Copenbagen, he was going to meet with a Mr. Sidney GLASIER, on American vijo is serving as Eirector of the Eleanor Roosevelt Cancer Foundation and who is going to put up most of the money for the production of the film "Hemlet" which A/1 expects to make while in Denmark. A/1, GLASIER and Robert BEERN (not 10/w the Child Movie star) have formed a financial corporagion to provide the money to back the film. The articles of the corporation are being drawn up in Svitzerland. The film is actually going to be produced by a Bene named Mogens SKOT-HANNEN who owns INCOMEN Laterna Film, address: Sct. Jorgensalle 10, Copenhagen. After conferring with SLASIER and SKOT-HAMSEN, A/1 intends to go to Stockholm where his girl-friend, Tvones ANDERSON, is arranging an apartment for him. Es intends to remain there until the actual time of production of the film beging in November, or at the latest, early December.

'A/l states that Ivonne ARMERSON is now working in the Swedish Foreign Ministry at a classified job dealing with the case of Swedes who have been trapped

in East Germany. One of the stimulations of the 10b is that she have no close association with foreigners; and; as a result, will have to quit her job when he arrives in Stochholm. He volunteured that he might be able to get additional nsterial for a report for the Soviets by eliciting from Yvonne the details of her classified Evediah job. I asked him whether he could elicit this information from her without revealing an undue interest. He said, "yes, it would be no problem; she tells as everything." I made no comment about not clearing this kind of report for passage to the Soviets, preferring to decide that question when and if he got the information from Ivonne. I asked him to if he intended to see his former partners in DEDECCO when he arrived in Sweden. He said he did not, his affairs with DEDCS had all been settled through his lawyor in Sweden and he is entirely out of it now. He had been able to obtain \$5,400 from the fire, which agrees anounted only to a payment for the time he had invested in the company. I asked him how his financial status was now, and he said it was good. (Loudwein had said that the FBI did not consider the case worth the expense of financing him on another trip abroad.) With regard to his relationship with us abroad, I gave him the contact plan cabled by the which he wrote down and promised to memoraize and then destroy the notes. I told him that what we hoped to do with the operation while he was abroad was to provide some contacts with the RIS, other than in Berlin and explained to his that we thought he had a good chance to do this because of the gresent international situation. The big problem is one officersmication with them, wends getting them to come out and make a meeting with him. I explained that since the death of his mother, the commo plan that they had for writing to him was disrupted and that this in itself would be sufficient ground for his seeking a renewed contact with them. In addition to this, we discussed the fact that they still owed him money for the last reports he immed turned in and the fact that he was now abroad for a long period of time and conceivably could be of substantial use to them.

"I asked him if he had brought any additional reports to the meeting, which would have to be cleared for passage to the Soviets. He said, "no", that with the death of his mother and the problem of settling her estate, he had had very little time to do snything clee. I then went with him over the report that he had previously given the FBI on the MARTIH and MINNERLL case. This report had come from Michael Krepin SUMAN, address" 2248 Highbury Avenue, Fast Los Angeles, Californis, who is presently a physics teacher at Los Angeles State University. SUMAN had known MARTIN quite well in Tokyo in 1953-1954 and had corresponded with him a great deal since that time. In the meanwhile, I've turned up an interesting piece of information which could be valuable as a report. However, instead of writing the final report, I'll give you all the details herein. This is because it may not be possible to use the data from a security standpoint and it might save us time to check that aspect out first. The material comes all from a single source, sy close friend, N.C. Sikian.

SUMM served with ASA at Far East Headquarters as a crypto clark during 1951-54. Buring that time he became closely associated with Bornon F. MITCHELL and Villies MERTIE, especially with MARTIN who was rather a good friend of his. You will recall that MARTIE and MITCHELL, later employed as statisticians with HEA, fled to the Bovist Union in June of 1960 and in September of 1960 appeared in Moscow to denounce the U.S. A considerable execut of publicity attended their defection. Main was recently contacted by ONI and interviewed moveral times by their agents regarding his knowledge of MATTH and MITTHELL. He has confided to me several interesting facts regarding these interviews. OH admitted to him that their main interest in continuing to investigate the onse was to uncover possible contests with the Soviets or others in the U.S. before they fled to Russia. They have been unable to determine whether or not the mon had passed secrets to Soviet agents in the U.S. while they were still employed by MSA and do not become exactlywhere or how they arranged for their escape from the U.S., other them that they made a clandestine trip to Maxico during the vinter of 1959 at which time the arrangements may have been made through intermediaries there. Furthermore, they had no proof that either of the men were astually communist. sympathicars or homosexuals as charged in the press. OH explained to SUMM that they believed MITCHELL to have been primarily involved and that MARTIE had been drawn along with him because of his close association and perhaps blackenil. The took a series of letters which SIMAN had received from MARTH and eventually returned them after study.

This information, although limited, has certain implications which could be of interest to the Soviets.---- particularly the status of the current investigation and what has been uncovered and what is still unamplained in the
