Re Bureau routing slip dated 12/12/62 enclosing blind memorandum regarding ALEX and Bern airtels to Bureau dated 12/31/62 and 1/19/63.

On 1/14/63 and 1/21/63 Brigadier GUIDO ZARA, Confidential Squad, Police Headquarters, Rome, Italy (protect identity), advised that GUS ALEX, born 4/1/16, in possession of U. S. passport number 1569555, issued Washington, D. C., on 5/13/59, stayed at the Hotel Excelsior, Rome, on 1/5/63. He was accompanied by ROSE M. DIETGARD-FUEGER, born 12/3/38, in Seewalch. She was in possession of German passport number 4119969, issued by the German Consulate in Chicago, Illinois.

From 1/6/63 to 1/8/63 ALEX, accompanied by DIETGARD-FUEGER, stayed at the Hotel Hassler, Piazza Trinita dei Monti, Rome, Italy. According to ZARA, ALEX and DIETGARD-FUEGER came to Rome from Milan, Italy, and left Rome on 1/8/63 for an unknown destination. During the time they were in Rome, ALEX and DIETGARD-FUEGER toured the city on foot and by taxi, and were not the subject of any suspect activity.

The Rome Office has alerted the Italian National Police and Greek police sources to Bureau's interest in subject and has asked for investigation in accordance with the requests set forth in referenced Bureau routing slip. To date no information has been received from these sources. Upon receipt of any information, Bureau and interested offices will be advised promptly.
