Today I received a phone call from Max Holland. After asking if I was responsible for DOJ records, he said that he was interested in records pertaining to Herbert Miller, who at the time of the assassination was head of the Criminal Division. Holland is interested in Miller's activities from the time of the assassination until the creation of the Warren Commission. He noted that Miller went to Dallas to serve as liaison between DOJ and local officials. I told him that I did not recall any records bearing on this in the Criminal Division files that have been made available at College Park. I told him that it seemed to me such records might be housed at the Kennedy Library, either as part of RFK's papers or as a separate collection of Miller's papers, and that we intended to review records at the Kennedy Library. He asked me if a FOIA request for such materials would be helpful or "superfluous." I told him that I would confer with Jeremy on this point. Jeremy, on your return to DC, could you call Holland back on this point or advise me what I should tell him? I will check logical databases, etc. to try to get a handle on the status of the records Holland described.
