Let me know if you have plans to go, and thanks!CALL REPORTDocument's Author: Eileen Sullivan/ARRB Date Created: 06/09/97 The Players Description of the Call Date: 06/09/97Subject: Rankin papersSummary of the Call:4:15 -- after several calls back and forth between me and Bill Grover, Steve Tilley called me to say that no search so far has yielded conclusive results.In an earlier conversation with Bill, he said that he did not see draft chapters 1 and 5 containing handwritten notes by Gerald Ford. He went on to say that he cannot say for sure that those particular drafts are not there, but he did not find them. According to Grover, the drafts were not filed in an orderly manner. In addition, they are filed by "date of draft", not by chapter number.I called Grover back with "dates of draft" (6/26/64 for both drafts, chapter 5 having a cover letter from Ford to Rankin dated 8/10/64) and then Steve Tilley called because Grover had to leave. Tilley said that there were some annotated drafts of chapter 1, two of which were done by McCloy, and the other is not identifiable. The drafts of chapter 5 are a mixed bag containing different chapter titles, including "The Murder of Lee Harvey Oswald."Tilley suggested that the only way to know for sure if these materials already exist in the Collection is for someone to go out to the Archives and compare.
