Sneed knows a lot of people in Dallas, particularly police.I will follow-up with him on D.L. Jackson's account of 11/22/63. In a separate memo, I will ask Dave Montague if we ever got anything from Tague. He said that it was possible, but that the two individuals who came to mind wrote contemporaneous accounts of what happened on 11/22/63. They are D.L. Jackson, a motorcycle cop, and James Tague, a private citizen who was injured by one of the shots during the assassination. He knows of no officers who have told him that they have records that they kept related to the assassination.
