All 390 of these records (385 consent releases, 5 released with redactions) were printed on paper from microfilm of the U.S. Army's incoming and outgoing Pentagon message traffic close to the time of the Kennedy assassination--primarily 1963. Tim Wray found the microfilm at the Federal Records Center at Suitland, and Tim, Eric Scheinkopf and Joe Masih decided what was relevant to the assassination (using a broad definition rather than a narrow one), and printed these on paper. Tim and Joe then travelled to the Army War College at Carlisle Barracks in Lancaster, Pennsylvania, and got most of the records declassified by an Army historian with declassification authority, Randy Rakers. Joe Masih and I then processed a few referrals through the CIA and DIA. The microfilm has been returned to Suitland. END
