	First, in direct answer to your question "Did the Warren Commission study Governor Connally's wounds?", the answer is yes, and the evidence is those pages of CE 392 (specifically, pages 531-537 of the Report itself) which are the contemporaneous written statements of Governor Connally's treating physicians. Furthermore, Governor Connally's wounds are discussed in the text on page 3 of the Report, as well as in other locations.Second, I forward the following recommendations (for inclusion in the subpoena) in response to your request:-any records pertaining to the wounding, treatment, death, and subsequent autopsy of Lee Harvey Oswald;-any records pertaining to the subsequent exhumation and post-exhumation examination of the remains of Lee Harvey Oswald (including any audiotaped or videotaped records of that event);-any records pertaining to the Warren Report as CE 392 (on pages 516-537); these are the contemporaneous or near-contemporaneous written statements of the Parkland physicians who treated President Kennedy and Governor Connally. In a September 15, 1997 written reply to an inquiry of mine, Mr. Steven Tilley wrote that the only original document from CE 392 located by Archives staff was the two-page typed summary of President Kennedy's wounds prepared and signed by Dr. Kemp Clark that is published on pages 517-518 of the Report. NARA staff does not know the whereabouts of all of the other original documents reproduced within
