Though Secret Service and the FBI copies of the Zapruder film are copies, because they were accessioned as records of the U.S. Assassination Records Review Board records, the aforesaid films are considered to be the record copy for that accession. You, therefore, would not be able to view the 8mm Secret Service nor the FBI copies of the Zapruder film. You can either view the frame-by-frame still pictures available in the Still Picture Branch, wait until we have a 16mm viewing copy, or buy a copy of the films you want to inspect. If the Motion Picture, Sound, and Video Branch reference staff can be of any further assistance, we will be pleased to assist you.
