In addition to the Ford notes from the Rankin papers (which I think I have organized in a way that we can use; Ford version compared to actual final report -- copies of both versions for reporters), I had a copy of a memo from Commission members McCloy had written to Rankin. It, too, is an interesting document. The question is, did this rather pointedly-worded memo from McCloy, marked "confidential," with no "cc's," make its way into the Warren Commission papers that are part of the JFK Collection prior to the arrival of the Rankin papers? It is dated June 24, 1964. McCloy made comments on Chapters Two and Three. He wrote a memo, in contrast to Ford, who, as you know, scribbled in the draft text he was using. At any rate, if you are talking to anyone about the Ford notes, it is the same question for the McCloy notes/memo. Thanks.
