It reads "Officials of the Assassinations (sic) Review Board said it would not be practical at this point to determine what action, if any, the FBI took on each lead provided by the Secret Service. The FBI did not comment." I was the only staff member who spoke with Dorman, and this is an inaccurate depiction of what I said. While working on the story yesterday, Dorman asked whether or not we had documents regarding specific leads that the Secret Service provided to the FBI, and what the FBI subsequently did with that information. I asked him if he had specific names and he said "yes." He went on to say that the story was just about complete and will most likely run in today's (10-24-97) paper. I told him that I could look into this request but it would require some research and I would not have all of the information before his deadline. I did tell him about a previous release by the Review Board regarding Homerio Echevarria and his father, former FBI informant Ebelia Echevarria. He said that would suffice and I faxed him the Boston Globe Dec. 21, 1995 clip about this release.When I addressed this inaccuracy today, Dorman immediately apologized and said, "That was not the most artful paragraph I have written." He said that he wrote it more to answer anticipated questions from his copy editors than for any other reason. He was contrite and said, "my fault. I'm sorry." Record N
