ASSASSINATION RECORDS REVIEW BOARD Approximately 800 pages of previously classified military records from 1963-64 that relate to U.S. policy on Vietnam are being released today by the Assassination Records Review Board, the independent federal agency overseeing the identification, review, and release of records related to the assassination of President John F. Kennedy. This is the second major release of military records on U.S. foreign policy from the 1960's by the Review Board in the last month. These military records on U.S. policy toward Vietnam add important depth to the historical record because they are from both before and after the assassination of President Kennedy, said Dr. Kermit L. Hall, a member of the Review Board. At the time of President Kennedy's death, Vietnam was increasingly becoming a matter of foreign policy concern. Any records that add substance to our understanding of the impact that the assassination had on U.S. policy in Vietnam are a welcomed addition to the JFK Collection at the National Archives and Records Administration. The mandate of the Review Board is to make the record surrounding the assassination of President Kennedy as complete as possible. The Board has been aggressive in its pursuit of records on U.S.
