Eileen,I just wanted to thank you and Chaiman Tunheim for your update. There are many of us "out here" that appreciate it.I do have a question, however. The letter seems to indicate that theremight even be more information released. I would hope that is the case. While voluminous, the releases (in my humble opinion) are still woefullyincomplete. The FBI bothered to write me a letter after I posted an e-mail to the President, asking him to further expidite the ARRB. Needless to sayI was a little surprised. The letter (from the Public Affairs Office) told me that the FBI had released "millions of documents" in the matter. So I'm a little cautious when I see 37,000 documents, as quoted in Chairman Tunheim's letter. The FBI indicated that it had been fully cooperative... but I know better. As I'm sure you are aware, the government agencies involved are loath to let ANYTHING out to the public... let alone sensitive information that may involve an agency's own foul-ups or wrong-doing. Hence myquestion, actually two:1) Do you or the ARRB feel there has been real cooperation with this effort? and,2) Do you or the ARRB feel that anything of real substance has been unearthed in this effort? While investigators will be pouring over this material for years, (if they can put the references together), I remain with the "doubting Thomas" side, that this will be the 3rd failed effort to discover the truth.
