The answer is>"yes". Just last month the Board released an additional 5,000 documents,>and this month the number is about the same. Also, keep in mind that our>release numbers compared to those of the FBI would naturally be different.>Whether the Board exists or not, the agencies are still mandated to release>their records related to the assassination of President Kennedy. The>agencies began transferring records to NARA before the Board was assembled.>>There has been cooperation with this effort. We have also established a>compliance program wherein agencies must declare, under penalty of perjury,>that they have made all efforts to locate all assassination records in>their custody.>>With regard to the substance of the material that has been released, we>cannot make judgments. We are here to release records. However, one>cannot overlook the amount of information that is available now that had>previously never been available. I think that is quite valuable.>>I hope I have addressed your questions and concerns. Thanks again for>writing.>>Sincerely,>>Eileen Sullivan>>>>
