The National Archives released on May 13, 1998 approximately 17,000 additional pages of FBI records relating to the assassination of President John F.Kennedy. These newly-released records relate to various individuals and groups that were of interest to the Committee's investigation of the assassination. The files, which were reviewed by the HSCA staff members to determine anyrelevance for the Committee's purpose, consist of main files and relateddocuments from other files for the subjects listed in the attachment. The JFKCollection already contains files on numerous HSCA subjects that were previously released. NARA will also release supplemental files on some subjects including Carlos Marcello, Angelo Bruno, and E. Howard Hunt. Among the files included in this release is the JFKCorrespondence/Administrative file which contains high level internal memoranda on a variety of topics, including the FBI monitoring of threatsagainst the President and rumors regarding Kennedy's personal life. The filealso contains documentation describing anti-Kennedy propaganda and a fewpieces of correspondence between Kennedy and J. Edgar Hoover. Although thebulk of the files date from the Kennedy Presidency, a small number of filespredate this period, beginning in 1947 during Kennedy's first term in theHouse of Representatives. The files end in 1976, with most post-Kennedy filesrelating to threats against Jacqueline Kennedy.
