To all, the Archives had a surprise release. I say "surprise" because I saw absolutely no advance publicity about it. And Malcolm Blunt who is in the Archives nearly every day didn't know it was coming. There was absolutely no mention of it at the ARRB's open meeting. I saw John Judge there, he gave no indication he knew anything about it. Tilley obviously favors the Associated Press as they were there in abundance. At least three AP reporters. Another with an AP microphone, which I took to mean this person was with AP radio. And there was at least two television cameras, one went around the room, another was positioned to look down on the table as yet another reporter went through documents. Gus Russo was there, as was Dan Alcorn. Did any of you know about it? There was supposedly a AP wire story about it Wednesday night, or Thursday morning. If anyone can find it on the internet send me a copy. The National Archives released on May 13, 1998 approximately 17,000 additional pages of FBI records relating to the assassination of President John F. Kennedy. These newly-released records relate to various individuals and groups that were of interest to the Committee's investigation of the assassination. The files, which were reviewed by the HSCA staff members to determine any relevance for the Committee's purpose, consist of main files and related documents from other files for the subjects listed in the attachment. The JFK Collection already contains files on numerous HSCA subjects that were previously released. NARA will also release supplemental files on some subjects including Carlos Marcello, Angelo Bruno, and E. Howard Hunt. Among the files included in this release is the JFK Correspondence/Administrative file which contains high level internal memoranda on a variety of topics, including the FBI monitoring of threats against the President and rumors regarding Kennedy's personal life. The file also contains documentation describing anti-Kennedy propaganda and a few pieces of correspondence between Kennedy and J. Edgar Hoover. Although the bulk of the files date from the Kennedy Presidency, a small number of files predate this period, beginning in 1947 during Kennedy's first term in the House of Representatives. The files end in 1976, with most post-Kennedy files relating to threats against Jacqueline Kennedy.
