May 12-13 Board Meeting:A total of 30 documents from the JFK Library were released in full. The majority of these records were from the Douglas Dillon papers, covering various aspects of the President's Committee on the Warren Report. The remaining documents released were National Security File records detailing military activities and planning against Cuba. The Board voted to release an additional three documents in part from the JFK Library's National Security files which dealt with military contingency planning against Cuba. The Board also voted to release another six documents from the State Department's files which primarily dealt with US Army defectors, as well as CIA reporting on Soviet's records on Oswald and Chairman Krushchev's view on the assassination. An additional six documents from the LBJ Library were released - 1 in part and 5 in full, highlighted by a CIA memo on a 2/21/64 meeting between John McCone and President Johnson, and State Department report on Vietnam Action Plan.
