Postal Inspector John G. Feitersaid in court papers that Cusack has admitted he forged the documents.Cusack, 47, provided author Seymour Hersh with documents purportedly showingthat Kennedy set up a trust for Monroe's mother to buy her daughter's silenceabout the alleged affair.The documents initially formed the basis for a chapter in Hersh's book "TheDark Side of Camelot." Hersh deleted the chapter before publication last yearafter their authenticity was challenged.Cusack claimed to have found 700 documents relating to the Kennedy family,Monroe and Chicago mob boss Sam Giancana in the files of his father, LawrenceCusack, a lawyer who died in 1985.Cusack, who is free on a \$2.5 million personal recognizance bond, is scheduledto be arraigned July 16. If convicted, he faces up to five years in prison anda \$250,000 fine on each of 13 fraud
