Subject: KGB documents on Oswald

I looked over the KGB documents as you requested. Other than two or three minor differences in dates from the CIA chronology, there are few surprises. The most interesting is that the documents mention that Oswald wrote a letter to the U.S. Embassy in December 1960 to explore the possibility of returning to the U.S. (p.10). The Embassy never received this letter and Oswald's diary refers to his Feb. 1, 1961 letter as his first request to the Embassy. The second interesting item is that Oswald's residency permit was only for one year--from Dec. 1, 1959-Dec. 1, 1960 (p.8). Given this limitation, why was he permitted to remain in the USSR after Dec. 1960? There is no mention of any extension on his residency permit and his marriage does not take place until
