Data bank	Purpose	Contents
Civillian	administrative	identification, job title, performance records, grade, tenure, veteran status
Military 201 file	administrative	identification, military data, education, assignment records, disciplinary records
Civillian qualification records system	evaluative for career development program	identification, skill areas, education, publications, awards, achievements
Joint table of distribution	administrative	roster of organizational positions and incumbents
Personnel security files	security clearance	identification, background investigation report, fingerprints, security clearance, personal history questionnaire, nondivulgence agreements, evaluation of background investigations, security violations, credit and character references

** By 1970, all banks were computerized except the personnel security files

Personnel included in the first four files listed in the table are notified of their inclusion in the bank. It is assumed by DIA that subjects in the final listed data bank understand that they have become part of a data bank when they complete the necessary security paperwork. It is unclear whether these data banks include DIA personnel only or if other military personnel are involved.
