David R. Montague was appointed as the Investigator for the Assassination Records Review Board on September 5, 1995. The Review Board is an independent federal agency authorized to identify, secure and make available all records related to the assassination of President John F. Kennedy.

David's role with the Review Board is to identify information regarding the assassination, negotiate and perform the acquisition of classified and unclassified material as well as to facilitate criminological research through traditional methods as well as the Internet and various law enforcement & intelligence entities. In this capacity David also serves as the Review Board's liaison to the Financial Crimes Enforcement Network (FINCEN), which is an intelligence agency within the United States Department of Treasury.

Previously, David was the senior fraud analyst for Chevy Chase Bank in Frederick, Maryland. While with Chevy Chase he designed and implemented new procedures for identifying and correcting fraud trends as well as performing fraud intelligence to show global credit card fraud.

Prior to his bank position, David served as an Investigator with the United States Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA) and was assigned to their office in Newark, New Jersey. He specialized in cases against physicians, pharmacists and companies suspected of violating federal laws and regulations dealing with controlled substances.

A 1989 graduate of Morehouse College in political science, David is also a 1991 graduate of the FBI Academy in Quantico, Virginia. He holds a master's degree from the George Washington University's Department of Forensic Science in white-collar criminology. He is a member of both Kappa Alpha Psi Fraternity, Inc. and the American Society of Criminology.

David was born in Washington, D.C. and now resides in Rockville, Maryland.
