- 1. The information at issue reveals nothing about current relationships, nothing about sensitive sources and methods, and nothing that has not already been publicly acknowledged and revealed.
- 2. There is significant public interest in the information. It deals with a topic that has invited persistent speculation because of the incomplete record. It is precisely this kind of information that Congress wanted released to the American people.
- 3. The Board's action was limited and discriminating. It did not recommend a wholesale release, but rather took a reasoned step to make available important information without compromising important relationships.
