Your response to our letter of ____ concerns me for several reasons. You stated that you have nothing to say on the Kennedy assassination

You have chosen to share your recollections about the autopsy of President Kennedy not only to official investigative bodies, but also to private individuals, researchers, and journalists. That you should refuse to speak to a US Government agency established by Congress with a serious and important mandate concerns me. I can well imagine that you do not relish the prospect of revisiting this issue, but I am afraid that our responsibilities set out in our enabling legislation compel us to make this request.

We again invite you to appear voluntarily at a deposition. We are fully prepared to issue a subpoena.
