This document is a follow-up to testimony by McGeorge Bundy before the Rockefeller Commission on April 7, 1975. The next day, according to David Belin, he “refreshed his recollection” and made some additions to the record.

Bundy on April 7th, in his testimony before the Rockefeller Commission, did not recall the word “poison” or something like that activity or proposal in relation to the Castro regime. But overnight he had a “vague recollection” and remembers there was a discussion, though he can not pinpoint the exact date, about a “proposal or scheme or project that did involve poison.” As Bundy remembers, “it never came anywhere near approval.” Bundy further said that proposals under MONGOOSE were reviewed first for “practicability and only after that for wisdom or political rightness.” He said he recalled “NO proposal for liquidation that ever got past the first stage to the second.”
