In connection with our inquiry into the release of records that involve the assassination of President John F. Kennedy, the Assassination Records Review Board requests that authorized representatives be granted access to all documents, files, records references and materials generated by, or in the possession of the Naval Criminal Investigative Service, or offices that come under the jurisdiction of the Naval Criminal Investigative Service. We request that your search include all registered alias or unregistered aliases or cryptonyms that were used by, or assigned to, such individual.

- 1) Lee Harvey Oswald aka Lee Henry Oswald, Henry Lee Oswald, Alex Hidell. Birthdate 10/18/39.
- 2) Reports or investigations that were conducted by your command in response to Oswalds defection to the Soviet Union after October 1959. Also, investigation that were conducted by the Marine Wing Headquarters Group 3, 3rd Marine Aircraft Wing, Santa Clara, California and Marine Corps Station-1 (MACS-1), of Marine Air Group-11, (MAG-11), 1st Marine Air Wing at Atsugi Naval Air Base.
- 3) Records or investigation involving the transfer of Lee Harvey Oswalds personnel file from the 9th Naval District (Great Lakes Region) to the 8th Naval District (New Orleans). Who authorized the transfer?

Attached is a copy of our statute that includes the provisions

authorizing the Board to request Assassination related records from all government agencies.
