Dear Mr. Mulhollan:

I am writing on behalf of the Assassination Records Review Board, an independent federal agency created by The President John F. Kennedy Assassination Records Collection Act of 1992, 44 U.S.C. § 2107 (Supp. V 1994) (JFK Act). I have enclosed a copy of a letter of this same date to the Librarian of Congress.

As you can see, our letter to the Librarian specifically references the Congressional Research Service (CRS) as a likely repository of assassination records. I therefore wanted to forward a copy of our letter directly to your attention. For your information, and as an example of the kinds of records in which the Review Board is interested, I have also enclosed some documents from the files of the House Select Committee on Assassinations (HSCA) that detail at least some of the work CRS did for the HSCA during the course of its investigation. In addition to these specific examples, there are presumably many other instances where CRS has generated assassination-related records in response to requests from Congressional offices.

We look forward to working with CRS as part of the Library's implementation of the JFK Act.
