Mann was in US on November 23

Mann was probably in embassy

All US offices in same building in MC

Embassy in Avenue de la Reforma upper half of building

CIA was on top floor

How many FBI 27 Legats

had its own separate communications

communicated without letting CIA and ambassador know

Problem in embassy: coordinate CIA and FBI
