Dear Ms. Bernstein:

I am writing in response to their previous discussions and the rules promulgated under Executive Order No. 12,866: Regulatory Planning and Review.

During the upcoming year, the Assassination Records Review Board ("Review Board") does not anticipates issuing any "significant" rules as they are defined in the Executive Order. However, the Review Board does anticipate issuing the following regulations and notice.

- 1. Defintion with description, etc.
- 2. Sunshine
- 3. Privacy
- 4. FOIA
- 5. Notice.
- 6. In addition, we are required, under our enabling legislation, 44 U.S.C. 2107, to issue regular notices of the results and status of the review process.

As you are aware, the Review Board previously issued for comment 1401, the definition of "assassination record." We have made amendments to the introductory segment of the regulation in order to satisfy your suggestion that we describe the process differently. I am now enclosing our

final version. Once we have received your approval, we will publish it promptly in the Federal Register.

With the exception of 1401, it is our assumption that you will not need to review any of the regulations identified above. We will, of course, await your decisions prior to issuing any rules.
