The Assassination Records Review Board (ARRB) is accepting applications for the position of General Counsel. The ARRB is an independent federal agency, created by statute, that has responsibility for collecting and reviewing records relating to the assassination of President Kennedy. The ARRB is exempt from certain Civil Service requirements. It is expected that the ARRB will be in existence until 1996 or 1997.

The ARRB is seeking a General Counsel with a broad legal background. Applicants must have excellent academic credentials, be familiar with relevant areas of the law, be able to obtain Top Secret and SCI clearances, and be available to start work immediately. Of particular value in potential candidates are the following: experience working with small federal agencies; knowledge of information-access law; knowledge of national security issues; experience dealing with large federal agencies (including the Justice Department, Congress; Defense Department, CIA, and other agencies); prior TS/SCI clearances; familiarity with issues surrounding the assassination of President Kennedy; experience with federal and state litigation; and experience with legal issues including personnel matters, FOIA, the Sunshine Act, etc. Candidates should send resumes and letters describing their experience to: David G.
