Lee Mathews, House Select Committee representative who viewed Secret Service documents

- 1. On December 13, 1977, Blakely requested preliminary survey report and investigative material leading to cancellation of November 2, 1963 Chicago trip
- 2. On December 28, 1977, Blakey confirmed with Robert Goff, Secret Service Chief Counsel, that Lee Mathews would have complete access to Secret Service files re Kennedy assassination.
- 3. On February 10, 1978, Blakey requested access to 1963 Secret Service files and records including COS classified materials stored at the Federal Record Center in Suitland, Maryland with respect to communications between field office agents in the cities listed in letter Feb. 10, 1978, White House detail, and Secret Service headquarters. Blakely specifically requested materials related to Presidential protection and security during the period, March, 1963-November, 1963. In the same letter Blakey requested material on Thomas Arthur Vallee.

Lee Mathews should say that he viewed all of the above material at Secret Service headquarters.

Lee Mathews should say that he viewed typewritten protective reports for the March-November, 1963.

Lee Mathews should say, if it is true, that he saw computerized lists of this material.

Lee Mathews should say that he saw material on cases relating to Presidential protection for the January-February 1964 period if this is true.
