Subject: Additional Records for Review at the November 13-14, 1996 Meeting

On October 29, 1996, the Secret Service responded to our SS-6 and SS-7 requests for records. Our SS-6 request was for seven files cited by number in the computer printout of information for Lee Harvey Oswald. Our SS-7 request included six individuals whose files we asked to see.

Of the seven files in the SS-6 request, the Secret Service supplied one "Protect Subject Abstract" and one "Protect Trip Abstract" (both are computer printouts) that could be considered "assassination records." One refers to activities of Marguerite Oswald, and the other describes references to the Kennedy assassination offered by Perry Russo. Staff recommendation: Only these two documents are "assassination records." The other records provided by the Secret Service are not assassination related.

The Secret Service provided one "Protect Subject Abstract" for Richard Lauchli. Lauchli was a co-founder of the Minutemen, and he was arrested at the FBI's Lake Ponchartrain raid. According to Peter Dale Scott, Lauchli supposedly transported arms to the confrontation at the University of Mississippi. Staff recommendation: assassination record.
