HSCA correspondence with other Congressional committees

- Generally correspondence from either Blakey or Stokes requesting access to testimony and staff interviews of previous Congressional investigations. Some outside contact reports between HSCA staff and staff of Senate Select Committee on Intelligence.
- There was much discussion concerning access of HSCA staff to documents acquired by the Intelligence Committee from the CIA and the FBI. Also discussion of access to testimony of CIA personnel. The HSCA produced a non-disclosure agreement which staff members signed prior to employment. There was also an addendum which governed information derived from Senate and House Select Committees on Intelligence documents. These are both attached to a February 9, 1978 letter from Louis Stokes to Birch Bayh.
- On February 2, 1978 J.L. Wolf wrote a summary of a meeting at the CIA
 concerning access of HSCA staff to Senate Select Committee on Intelligence
 materials. They discussed the nondisclosure agreement, plots against Castro, the
 difference between access and delivery, and note taking by HSCA staff.
- On January 25, 1978, Wolf summarized a meeting with Mike Epstein of the Senate
 Select Committee on Intelligence concerning access.

For some reason there are almost no letters to the House Intelligence Committees or the committees assigned oversight of the FBI which conducted hearings on issues of interest to us such as the destruction of the Oswald note to Hosty and the record keeping practices of the FBI.
