The Review Board staff is looking forward to meeting with you. We will be expecting you in our offices in Washington, D.C., at approximately 12:00 p.m. on Monday, November 18th. Our offices are located on the second floor at 600 E Street, N.W. Your interview will begin on Monday afternoon and continue on Tuesday, November 19th. We would like to conduct an audiotaped interview and would like to ask you at the beginning to make your statements under oath. You will, of course, receive copies of the audiotapes.

When you come for your interview, please bring with you any records related to the assassination of President Kennedy that you may have in your possession. The Review Board is particularly interested in those original records that you mention in your book, *Assignment: Oswald*, such as the FBI assignment cards on the Oswalds, your handwritten notes from the police interrogation of Lee Harvey Oswald, your written answers to the questions posed to you by Inspector Gale through Special Agent Shanklin, and the notes that you took in the late afternoon on November 22, 1963, on your "pad of blank police affidavit forms" where you transcribed entries from Oswald's notebook. We also would appreciate your brining any documents you may have relating to your testimony before the Warren Commission, and any Congressional Committees, including correspondence, recordings, or transcripts.

You *need not* bring with you any records you have obtained from the National Archives, or any records you obtained through the Freedom of Information Act and Privacy Act from your FBI personnel file.

If you are uncertain about whether the Review Board would be interested in viewing any particular records, please feel free to call and discuss with us whether to bring the records with you. If you

have any other questions, you should not hesitate to call. Thank you for your continued cooperation with our work.
