Michelle talked to former Ambassador Boonstra on Thursday. He said that the FBI had 27 agents in Mexico City in 1963. There were 1200 embassy employees at the time. Ambassador Boonstra also stated that the FBI was the only agency who had direct communication links to its HQ in Washington. All other American agency personnel had to communicate through the State Department. Carl Valentine told me that the FBI people there would have taken up "embassy slots."
