Dear Carol:

As we discussed by telephone today, I am enclosing a list of FOIA cases that deal with assassination-related records. I talked to Ron after I talked to you and he gave me a list of cases that comprise the major assassination-related FOIA litigation with which we are familiar. He sent this list of cases to DOJ, Civil Division and asked the Civil Division to make their files on these cases available to us. The Civil Division has agreed to provide these files for our review and Ron informs me that he will be going to DOJ next week to review the files.

- 1. Weisberg v. Department of Justice, No. 75-0226 (D.D.C.). This case involved a request for spectrographic and/or neutron activation analyses conducted by the FBI on bullet fragments and other materials at issue in the Kennedy assassination. Several FBI agents were deposed in this case with respect to the FBI Laboratory Division records relating to the JFK assassination investigation.
- 2. *Allen v. Department of Justice*, No. 81-1206 (D.D.C.). This case involved a request for FBI records made available to the HSCA.
- 3. Weisberg v. Department of Justice, Nos. 78-322 and 78-420 (D.D.C.). These cases involved requests for the FBI Dallas and New Orleans field office files relating to the JFK assassination.
- 4. *Blakey v. Department of Justice*, No. 81-2174 (D.D.C.). This case involved a request for FBI Headquarters records relating to the JFK assassination.
- 5. *Lesar v. Department of Justice*, Nos. 82-3600 and 86-1547 (D.D.C.). These cases involved issues regarding the destruction of copies of FBI records relating to the JFK assassination.

For your information, I am also faxing to you the first two pages of a letter that we sent to DOJ last February that further explains our objectives in reviewing FOIA files. The letter may provide you with some background information that will help to focus your search for these records.
