I am writing to follow up on

-confirm that Laura Denk gave Mr. Miller a memorandum briefly summarizing Customs' responsibilities under § 5 of the JFK Act.

-determine whether Customs has contacted Steve Tilley and received electronic identification aid materials

-express some concerns that resulted as a result of Mr. Miller's visit to the ARRB on November 30, 1995. At that meeting, Mr. Miller told members of my staff that...

-he believed that Laura Denk's [date] letter to Customs had been counterproductive

-the letter was written in response to Mr. Miller's statement to members of our staff that it would be difficult for him to take additional time *off* to complete a thorough review of the unindexed boxes at Suitland. Although Customs has consistently promised to cooperate and to comply with the Act, such a statement indicates that its attitude is otherwise.
