Subject: Gestetner Interview

In preparation for the Gestetner interview, I offer the following observations and suggestions.

- I have attached selected pages from the outline of the Goodpasture deposition that are pertinent to Gestetner's position and responsibilities in the Mexico City station. We have already done a significant amount of work in preparing this outline and so I suggest that we use these pages as the foundation for the interview. I have added more questions to these pages; they appear in red ink.
- I have read and taken notes on the HSCA testimonies of Gestetner and Dillinger; you may wish to do so as well. They are relatively short and very interesting. Moreover, the two of them seem to have different recollections as to the events surrounding Oswald's visit to Mexico City.
- Relating to the above paragraph, an area that requires further introspection is the division of responsibilities between Gestetner and his wife. Because his wife was the CIA officer who drafted the initial cable regarding Oswald's visit to Mexico City, we need to clarify the standard operating procedures that would have been followed by her. I suggest that we ask Gestetner if we could meet with his wife as well.
- I have collected and attached documents that may be helpful for us in preparing for the interview, as well as in assisting Gestetner to recall the Mexico City Station activities from thirty years ago. The majority of these documents concern the pre-assassination time period in Mexico City and the events immediately following the assassination. We used many of these as exhibits in the Goodpasture deposition.
