Dear Max:

I enjoyed talking to you this morning about the work of the Review Board with FBI records. I hope you found the discussion useful as well.

Enclosed are copies of the records I struggled to remember this morning about the authorization of the electronic surveillance on Marina Oswald. Obviously, you should rely on the records themselves, rather than my attempt to characterize them from memory. They are copied from the Headquarters 62-109060 file, between serials 7405 and 7406, although I am sure they appear in other file locations as well. They do not contain "new" information -- in fact, they were released under the Freedom of Information Act in the 1970's -- but you may still find them interesting.

I also wish to point you to some relatively new releases under the JFK Act concerning the FBI's activities in Mexico. Our office photocopies of these records still bear FBI classification markings, so I cannot make copies of them for you. However, the originals have been declassified and sent by the FBI for unredacted release to the public in the JFK Collection. Steve Tilley may not yet have had the opportunity to insert the unredacted records into the appropriate file sections, but I hope he can retrieve them for you if you are interested.
