Dear Colonel Carr:

Enclosed are two documents that were referenced, but not attached, to my February 21, 1997 letter to you for the purpose of providing the Air Force with additional leads in locating assassination records.

The first enclosed document is a November 1959 Naval message on Oswald after his defection to the Soviet Union that was sent to "OSI/USAF," presumably the Office of Special Investigations at the Air Force. The other is a December 17, 1959 memorandum of F.L. Welch, Assistant Chief, Counterintelligence Division, showing that the Air Force Chief of Staff's office ordered a security investigation of John E. Pic, Oswald's half-brother.

Please also note that, in my February 21 letter, two paragraphs were mistakenly designated "c" and "3" and should have been numbered "3" and "4," respectively.
