Dear Mr. Chairman:

As you know, the Assassination Records Review Board ("Review Board") has been securing the public release of records relating to the assassination of President Kennedy pursuant to its Congressional mandate under the President John F. Kennedy Assassination Records Collection Act of 1992, 44 U.S.C. § 2107 ("JFK Act").

In preparation for writing the Final Report of the Review Board, we discovered that the House Administration Committee, in April of 1983, held hearings regarding public release of records of the House Select Committee on Assassinations ("HSCA"). Congressman Stewart McKinney introduced a resolution (H. R. Res. 160, 98th Cong., 1st Sess. (1983)) that would have accelerated public disclosure of the HSCA records. According to the Congressional Research Service's overview on the disclosure of JFK assassination records, the resolution was referred to the House Administration Committee, and hearings were held on the matter, but the resolution never went to the House floor for a vote.¹

Any extant records relating to Congressman McKinney's resolution are likely to be assassination records as defined by Congress in § 3(2) of the JFK Act. Accordingly, we ask that any such Congressional records, to the extent not already public, be made available for our review to determine if they should be included in the JFK Assassination Records Collection at the National Archives and Records Administration. We are interested in resolving this matter as quickly as possible because the Review Board is scheduled to terminate its operations at the end of this fiscal year.
