In connection with the search of the Defense Intelligence Agency ("DIA") for records relating to the assassination of President Kennedy, please locate all DIA records relating to its work in assisting then Secretary of Defense Robert S. McNamara in responding to any inquiries of the Warren Commission.

For example, in September 1964, DIA had requested the Navy, Air Force, and Army to provide information to assist Secretary McNamara in responding to a Warren Commission request for an affidavit regarding whether Oswald was an agent or informant for the military intelligence agencies. DIA also sought information from these defense agencies to respond to the Warren Commission's request for any information regarding any alleged domestic or foreign involvement in a conspiracy. *See* DIA's September 17, 1964 Memorandum to the Secretaries of the Army, Navy and Air Force (attached hereto). It is apparent, therefore, that DIA had a role in collecting information in connection with the Warren Commission investigation, and the Review Board requests access to those DIA records.
