In connection with our scheduled review of certain Attorney General and Deputy Attorney General records identified for the Department of Justice (*see* R. Haron October 3, 1997 and December 10, 1996 letters), you have advised me today that the records we will be reviewing contain no classified materials and that any classified materials from these files are stored separately (under a different accession number). We were not previously advised that the classified portion of these records are stored separately. Thus, our review, scheduled for tomorrow at the Federal Records Center in Suitland, Maryland, will necessarily be incomplete.

It is essential that we inspect *all* documents--classified or unclassified--that were contained in the files of Attorneys General Levi and Bell, and Deputy Attoney General Civiletti, that we previously identified for review. Accordingly, please make available for our inspection any indices or finding aids for the classified records of these officials so that we can appropriately identify the classified portion of their files that should be reviewed.
